Rube soon moved from San Francisco to New York to work for a newspaper called, The Evening Mail. His job was to draw cartoons every day. He eventually became famous for his creative and original work as an artist.

Rube Goldberg is best known for his hand-drawn, "inventions." A Rube Goldberg invention consists of an elaborate set of slides, wheels, gears, handles, cups and rods, put in motion by balls, pails, boots, paddles, food and live animals. His contraptions take a simple task and make it extra complicated to complete.

Some of his solutions include, How To Get The Cotton Out Of A Bottle, a Self-Operating Napkin, and a Simple Alarm Clock.

Interestingly enough, you can find Rube Goldberg in the dictionary, listed as an adjective.

Rube never built the machines he created, but his cartoons have become an inspiration to would-be engineers and scientists around the world.

Rube Goldberg's work represents the best in American innovation, humor and creative thinking. He is an inspiring model for us all.
